

Introducing the Holodex

“The mind of God is not separate from the mind of man.”

“Do you have a memory? Yes, of course. As you’re a fractal of universe, we must presume that universe has a memory as well—a memory in which the Homo-centric collective consciousness is but a small part.”

You’re familiar, no doubt, with the concept of the “collective consciousness.” The postulate of a collective consciousness was offered by the psychologist Carl Jung as a reasonable explanation for a number of curious cultural phenomena, such as the occurrence of the same, or very similar, symbols in early societies distant from one another in time and space.

In our time, the concept has been validated by the work of Dr. David Hawkins, master of the science of kinesiology. Rather than discuss his work at this time, I’d like simply to suggest that you read his book *Power vs Force—The Hidden Determinants of Human Behavior*—cover to cover.

The holographic model of universe, which has emerged in the past several decades, offers a theoretical framework for not only the postulate of a collective consciousness, but also the postulate of a universal consciousness.

An early symbol of the universal consciousness is the “Akashic Record,” which is defined as the record of everything that ever occurred in the universe, including every thought.

A contemporary symbol is provided by Robert Monroe, founder of the well-known Monroe Institute. Using a variety of ways of altering normal human consciousness, Dr. Monroe and his associates developed a fascinating picture of the “landscape” of the after-life. One of the most interesting (to me) places in the after-life is the “Great Library at Focus 27.”

Now ... it occurred to me some time ago that the idea of a localized Great Library is aligned with ordinary human experience, but not with the holo-model. In that model, everything, including the said Library, is distributed *non-locally*. I call this presence “The Mentor.” Not long ago, I fell asleep while working out a plan for this section of this site. As I was awakening the following morning, I heard the voice of The Mentor in my head. “The mind of God,” the voice said, “is not separate from the mind of man.”

“The closer you get to God, the funnier everything seems,” the breatharian guru Wylie Brooks once remarked to me. I can vouch for that. Some twenty years ago, The Mentor appeared in my dream and handed me a postcard. After reading the postcard, I woke up laughing. Later, I wrote up the experience as a poem...
